ADDRESS JOB BARRIERS FOR NON-CUSTODIAL, COURT-REFERRED PARENTS OF TANF CHILDREN

TARGETED OUTCOMES FOR GRANT WERE:

- ENROLL 160 REFERRED PARENTS INTO JUDICIAL COURT PILOT
- 50% OF PARTICIPANTS PLACED IN FULL OR PART-TIME EMPLOYMENT

Impact

- 143 PARTICIPANTS REFERRED BY THE COURT
 OF THOSE 67% ENROLLED IN THE JUDICIAL COURT PILOT
- 30 PARTICIPANTS WERE PLACED IN JOBS WITHIN 90 DAYS OF ENROLLMENT 36 GRADUATED FROM THE JUDICIAL COURT PILOT
- 61% OF PARTICIPANTS WERE PLACED IN UNSUBSIDIZED EMPLOYMENT
