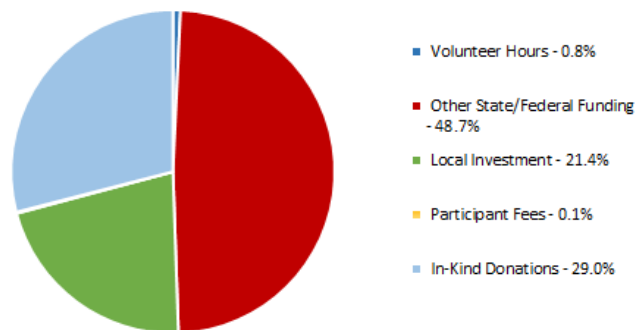
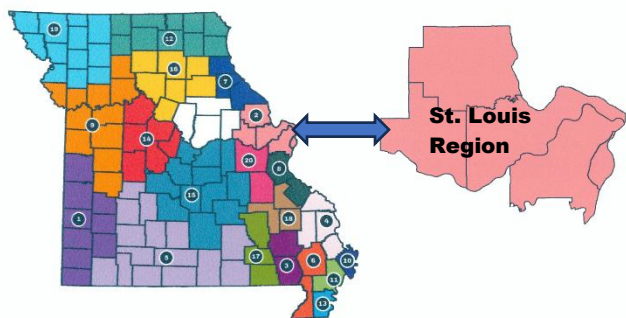


ARCHS' FY26 Mid-Year Community Impact Report

About ARCHS:

Area Resources for Community and Human Services (ARCHS) is Missouri's "community partnership" serving the St. Louis region.

ARCHS transforms the lives of thousands of St. Louisans through strategic and impactful initiatives in partnership with **the State of Missouri and area human service agencies.**

ARCHS funds and strategically enhances initiatives that improve the lives of children and families facing disparities and disadvantages in St. Louis' most resource deprived communities. ARCHS works to disrupt on-going cycles of generational poverty by advancing lifelong learning.

ARCHS has a successful 28-year history of leveraging public and private resources. For the past 24 fiscal years, ARCHS' financial statements have earned unmodified, or "clean," audits from independent auditors.

Partner Agency Impact: (FY26 YTD)

- **32** human service agencies funded and supported via **9** community initiatives

Human Impact: (FY26 YTD)

- **103,970** people served

Economic Impact:

- **\$49.3 million** (FY26 YTD)
 - \$23.3 million in state grant funding to partner agencies
 - \$26 million in local matches (additional funds/resources contributed by partner agencies)
- **\$28 to \$1:** For every dollar of Missouri's investment in ARCHS' base Community Partnership budget, ARCHS is adding a local match of an additional **\$28.** (FY26 YTD)
- **\$2.3+** million in wages reinvested each month back into the economy via people obtaining employment with an average \$18.26 hourly salary – spending that money locally on goods/services. (FY25)
- **\$6+ million** annually reinvested back into the local community through the value (what parents would pay out of pocket) for free after school/youth programs. (FY25)
